State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Nighttime Lane Closures Begin January 18 *At Burton Drive Mile Marker (MM) 92.6*

MIAMI, Fla. – On Tuesday, January 18 and Wednesday, January 19, 2022, the inside travel lanes along SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway at Burton Drive will be closed in the northbound direction, between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., for pavement reconstruction.

At least one lane will remain open at all times, during this work, and flaggers will direct traffic through the work zone. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing intersection project of SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway at Burton Drive.
