### **State Road (SR) 5/US 1 Nighttime Lane Closures Begin March 6**

*At Burton Drive Mile Marker (MM) 92.6, East Burton Drive, Access Road and US 1*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – Beginning Sunday, March 6 through Monday, March 7, 2022, travel lanes through the intersection of SR 5/US 1/Overseas Highway will be closed from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., while workers stripe the road. During this work, at least one lane will remain open at all times and flaggers will direct traffic through the area.

Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

**Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
