### **State Road (SR) 7/NW 2 Avenue Roadway Project Begins March 18**

*From NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Avenue to NW 188 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of March 18, 2022, along SR 7/NW 2 Avenue from NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Drive to NW 188 Street. The work will last about six months and cost an estimated \$777,777.

The scope of work includes: extending the northbound SR 7/NW 2 Avenue left turn lane to westbound NW 188 Street; restricting the southbound SR 7/NW 2 Avenue left turn to eastbound NW 187 Street; upgrading traffic signals, signs, and pavement markings; upgrading pedestrian curbs, ramps and sidewalks; installing new landscaping and an irrigation system at NW 187 Street; and repaving and restriping the roadway.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes, sidewalks and establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

**Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
