## State Road (SR) 817/NW 27 Avenue Roadway Project Begins Week of July 25, 2022

*From south of NW 203 Street to south of NW 215 Street and NW 27 Avenue at 19500 Block*

**MIAMI, Fla.** –The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of July 25, 2022. The project limits extend along SR 817/NW 27 Avenue from south of NW 203 Street to south of NW 215 Street and NW 27 Avenue at 19500 Block in Miami-Dade County. This project will cost an estimated \$2.9 million and will take about nine months to complete.

The scope of work includes creating a new signalized intersection at NW 195 Street, replacing traffic signals at NW 207 Street, improving pedestrian signals at NW 203 Street and NW 211 Street, widening the roadway at northbound 21000 Block, improving lighting at various intersections, stabilizing erosion of the west canal bank north of NW 207 Street, replace guardrail at various locations, upgrading signs and pavement markings, replacing bridge joints at NW 203 Street, installing a new special driveway at NW 203 Street, replacing pedestrian curb ramps, sidewalks and curb and gutter at various locations, adjusting utility manholes and valves at several locations, modifying landscaping at various locations and repaving and restriping roadway.

Construction will be done in stages with temporary lane closures scheduled to avoid special community events and peak periods of traffic. Temporary sidewalk detours will be in place when necessary. Access to and from adjacent neighborhoods and businesses will be maintained during construction.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
