SR 817/ NW 27 Avenue Nighttime Lane Closures Begin Sunday, October 6

From NW 187 Street to north of SR 826/Palmetto Expressway

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of the ongoing Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Roadway Project on State Road (SR) 817/NW 27 Avenue from NW 135 Street to NW 187 Street, there will be nighttime lane closures beginning Sunday, October 6, through Thursday, November 21 from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., for paving.

At least one lane in each direction northbound and/or southbound along SR 817/NW 27 Avenue will be closed between NW 187 Street and just north of SR 826/Palmetto Expressway. There will be no lane closures on Friday or Saturday nights during this period.

Access to businesses and side streets will always be maintained. Law enforcement officers will be on-site to assist with traffic follow. Please note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
