### **State Road (SR) 826/Palmetto Expressway Frontage Road/W 20 Avenue Project Has Begun**

*From NW 122 Street/W 68 Street to NW 138 Street/W 84 Street*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has begun a roadway project along SR 826/Palmetto Expressway Frontage Road/W 20 Avenue from NW 122 Street/W 68 Street to NW 138 Street/W 84 Street in the City of Hialeah. This project will cost an estimated \$2 million and will take about seven months to complete.

The scope of work includes repaving and restriping the roadway, upgrading pedestrian curb ramps, signage and pavement markings and installing a new stormwater drainage system on W 20 Avenue.

Access to and from adjacent neighborhoods and businesses will be maintained during construction. Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
