Nighttime Closures along State Road (SR) 826/Palmetto Expressway at NW 37 Avenue Begin May 9

For Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Project

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Tuesday, May 9 there will be lane closures and detours along eastbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway at NW 37 Avenue to perform work as part of the ITS Replacement Project. These closures will occur nightly through Thursday, May 11, 2023. The lane closures are as follows:

Tuesday, May 9 through Thursday, May 11 from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Two eastbound lanes along SR 826/Palmetto Expressway between NW 37 Avenue and NW 27 Avenue will be closed. One lane will remain open at all times. The eastbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway entrance ramp at NW 37 Avenue will also be closed. A detour will be established for those traveling east along NW 167 Street wishing to enter eastbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway.

Drivers traveling east along NW 167 Street will have to:

- Continue east along NW 167 Street
- Enter the expressway at the eastbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway entrance ramp just east of NW 27 Avenue


