## State Road (SR) 826/Palmetto Expressway, Florida's Turnpike and Palmetto Expressway Lane and Ramp Closures and Palmetto Expressway Traffic Shift

Monday, April 1 to Friday, April 5

**MIAMI, Fla.** – The following ramp and lane closures and traffic shift are scheduled between Monday, April 1, and Friday, April 5, 2024.

On Monday, April 1, Wednesday, April 3, and Thursday, April 4, from 11:59 p.m. to 5 a.m., the ramp from eastbound Palmetto Expressway to southbound I-95 will be closed, and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Continue east on Palmetto Expressway to NW 7 Avenue Extension
- Turn right onto SR 7/US 441/NW 2 Avenue
- Take the ramp on the left-hand side for southbound I-95

On Thursday, April 4, from 11:59 p.m. to 5 a.m., the ramp from southbound Turnpike to southbound I-95 will also be closed, and traffic will be detoured as follows:

- Continue south on the Turnpike to exit at NW 167 Street
- Turn right onto southbound NE 6 Avenue
- Turn right onto westbound Opa-locka Boulevard
- Take the ramp on the left-hand side for southbound I-95

On Friday, April 5, at 5 a.m., traffic will be shifted to the left on the ramp from eastbound Palmetto Expressway to southbound I-95. Friday, April 12 is an alternate date for the traffic shift.

## I-95 between NW 135 Street and the Golden Glades Interchange

 From 11 p.m. to 5 a.m., up to two lanes in both directions will be closed as needed.

## Palmetto Expressway between NW 12 Avenue and NW 7 Avenue Extension

At 9 p.m., one lane in both directions will be closed as needed.

At 11 p.m., a second lane in both directions will be closed as needed.

## Florida's Turnpike between NW 183 Street/Miami Gardens Drive and I-95

 From 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., up to two lanes in both directions will be closed as needed.

All lanes and ramps will reopen at 5 a.m. Please note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
