SR 826/Palmetto Expressway Southbound Exit Ramp to SR 964/NW 103 St/W 49 Avenue to Close

Monday, May 23 through Thursday, May 26

MIAMI, Fla. – Monday, May 23 through Thursday, May 26, 2022, the southbound SR 826/Palmetto Expressway exit ramp to SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street will be closed from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. while crews prepare to shift traffic on the ramp.

During this closure, southbound drivers should:

- Exit at SR 25/US 27/Okeechobee Road westbound
- Turn north at NW 87 Avenue to get back to SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. Drivers should anticipate delays and seek alternate routes if possible.
