FDOT State Road (SR) 90/US 41/SW 8 Street at SW 70 Avenue Aroundthe-Clock Lane Closure Begins June 19

MIAMI, Fla. – **MIAMI, Fla.** – Beginning the week of June 19, the outside lane of SR 90/SW 8 Street will be closed at SW 70 Street around-the-clock so workers can complete stormwater drainage improvements in the area. One westbound travel lane will remain open. This work will take about two weeks.

The Walmart business property exit from southbound SW 70 Avenue to SW 8 Street will also be closed and a detour will be in place. Motorists who wish to travel eastbound onto SW 8 Street when exiting the business property will follow this detour:

- Turn right onto westbound SW 8 Street
- Turn left onto southbound SW 72 Avenue
- Turn left onto SW 9 Street
- Turn left onto northbound SW 70 Avenue
- Turn right to connect with eastbound SW 8 Street

Please refer to the detour map below for a visual representation of the detour route. Access will remain open to go north on SW 70 Avenue from SW 8 Street to enter the business property.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. Drivers should anticipate delays and seek alternate routes if possible. Access to and from adjacent neighborhoods and businesses will be maintained during construction.
