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SR 90/US 41/SW 8 Street at SW 109 Avenue Pedestrian Bridge Replacement Project Begins Week of November 3

MIAMI, Fla. – Starting Sunday, November 3, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will implement various nighttime roadway closures and detours for the construction efforts on SR 90/SW 8 Street and SW 109 Avenue. These closures are necessary for concrete work, roadway modifications, and pedestrian access improvements in the area.

Sunday, November 3 through Tuesday, November 5

As part of the roadway modifications, travel lanes in both directions on SR 90/SW 8 Street will be shifted south to create a work zone on the roadway's north side. The number of travel lanes along SW 8 Street will remain the same.

To establish this work zone, crews will close two lanes in both directions nightly from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. along SW 8 Street. There will also be closures along SW 109 Avenue at SW 7 Street to establish a temporary pedestrian crosswalk. This pedestrian crosswalk will provide a safe crossing for pedestrians along SW 109 Avenue.

Motorists traveling along eastbound SR 90/SW 8 Street will experience lane closures from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. along the inside through lane and the left turn lane from SW 8 Street onto SW 109 Avenue. All lanes will reopen by 5:30 a.m. on weekdays.

During this closure, drivers traveling east on SR 90/SW 8 Street who want to go on to SW 109 Avenue should:

- Continue straight on SW 8 Street
- Turn left on SW 107 Avenue
- Turn left on SW 7 Street to reach SW 109 Avenue

Motorists traveling along westbound SR 90/SW 8 Street will experience lane closures from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. along the center through lane and the right turn lane from SW 8 Street onto SW 109 Avenue. All lanes will reopen by 5:30 a.m. on weekdays.

During this closure, drivers going west on SR 90/SW 8 Street who want to go on to SW 109 Avenue should:

- Continue straight on SW 8 Street

- Turn right on SW 107 Avenue
- Turn left on SW 7 Street to reach SW 109 Avenue

Motorists traveling along southbound SW 109 Avenue will experience full closures from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. between SW 7 Street and SW 8 Street to install the temporary pedestrian crosswalk at SW 7 Street. All lanes will reopen by 5:30 a.m. on weekdays.

During this closure, drivers traveling south on SW 109 Avenue who want to go on to SW 8 Street should:

- Continue straight on SW 109 Avenue
- Turn left on SW 7 Street
- Turn right on SR 985/SW 107 Avenue to reach SW 8 Street

Wednesday, November 6 and Thursday, November 7

Motorists traveling along westbound SR 90/SW 8 Street will experience full closures at SR 985/SW 107 Avenue from 10 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. and traffic will be detoured. All lanes will reopen by 5:30 a.m. on weekdays.

During this closure, drivers traveling west on SR 90/SW 8 Street who wish to continue traveling westbound on SW 8 Street should:

- Turn left from SW 8 Street onto SW 107 Avenue
- Continue straight on SW 107 Avenue
- Turn right onto Coral Way/SW 24 Street
- Continue straight on Coral Way/SW 24 Street
- Turn right on SW 117 Avenue
- Continue straight on SW 117 Avenue to reach SW 8 Street

The pedestrian crosswalk on the west side of the intersection at SR 90/SW 8 Street and SW 109 Avenue will be **removed and no longer available for use**. Pedestrians will be directed to use the historic bridge on the east side of SW 109 Avenue to cross the C-4 Canal and use the crosswalk on the east side of SR 90/SW 8 Street.

To complete this project safely, lane closures and detours will be established as necessary during non-peak hours to avoid special community events and peak hours of traffic. Access to adjacent neighborhoods, businesses and schools will be maintained. Pedestrian detours will be established with clear signage. Work will be done in stages to minimize impacts and ensure traffic flows safely through the work zone.
