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SR 913/Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridge Weeknight Ramp Closures Begin Monday, May 20

MIAMI, Fla. – As part of necessary ongoing rehabilitation work, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will begin replacing guardrail along the westbound State Road (SR) 913/Rickenbacker Causeway Flyover Bridge on Monday, May 20. Work will be performed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. for four nights. This work is part of the I-95 Ramp Improvement Project, which began in February and will continue through early 2025.

Monday, May 20 and Tuesday, May 21:

The ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to northbound Interstate 95 (I-95) will be closed and traffic will be detoured between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. as follows:

Drivers going west on the Rickenbacker Causeway who want to go north on to SR 9A/I-95 should:

- Stay in the left lane to go towards Coconut Grove/ Brickell Avenue
- Continue west onto SW 26 Road to the entrance I-95 northbound entrance ramp

During these closures, the ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to southbound SR 5/US 1 will remain open during and all lanes will reopen between 6 a.m. and 9 p.m.

Wednesday, May 22 and Thursday, May 23:

The ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to southbound SR 5/US 1 will be closed and traffic will be detoured between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. as follows:

Drivers going west on the Rickenbacker Causeway who want to go south to SR 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway will:

- Stay in the left lane towards Coconut Grove/ Brickell Avenue
- Continue west on SW 26 Road
- Turn left onto South Miami Avenue to reach SR 5/US 1/South Dixie Highway

Nighttime shoulder closures may occur on the entrance ramp from SW 25 Road to northbound SR 9A/I-95 between 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. During this operation, lanes will be shifted, but will remain open.

During these closures, the ramp from westbound Rickenbacker Causeway to northbound SR 9A/I-95 will remain open and all lanes will reopen between 6 a.m. and 9 p.m.

Detours will be clearly marked. Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
