State Road (SR) 922/NE 125 Street at NE 10 Avenue Intersection Project Completed

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has successfully completed the SR 922/NE 125 Street intersection project at NE 10 Avenue in the City of North Miami. The seven-month project began in February 2021 and cost an estimated \$589,600. This project was completed on time and under budget with the support of elected officials and the community. Horsepower Electric, Inc. was the contractor.

The scope of work for this project included: replacing existing traffic signals at the intersection; installing drainage; upgrading pedestrian ramps; and repaving and resurfacing the roadway.
