State Road (SR) 924/NW 119 Street/Gratigny Road Roadway Project Begins March 14

From NW 27 Avenue to NW 7 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of March 14, along SR 924/NW 119 Street/Gratigny Road from NW 27 Avenue to NW 7 Avenue. The work will last roughly 13 months and will cost an estimated \$4.1 million.

The scope of work includes: rehabilitating bridge over Rio Vista Canal (# 870621); repaving and restriping the roadway; modifying traffic separators between NW 27 Avenue and NW 22 Avenue; reconstructing pedestrian crosswalks, sidewalks, driveways, and curb and gutters; upgrading drainage structures; replacing traffic signal mast arms at the intersection of NW 17 Avenue; and upgrading vehicular and pedestrian signs, signals and pavement markings.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes, sidewalks and establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

During the scheduled nighttime bridge rehabilitation work, motorists will experience a traffic shift along eastbound and westbound SR 924/NW 119 Street/Gratigny Road. Please follow all posted signage and use caution when traveling through the construction zone.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
