State Road (SR) 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street Nighttime Lane Closures Begin October 18

At the Intersection of E 8 Avenue/LeJeune Road

MIAMI, Fla. – One Tuesday, October 18 and Thursday, October 20, travel lanes at intersection of SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street and E 8 Avenue/LeJeune Road will be closed between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., to install traffic signal foundations at the NW and SE corners of the intersection. Law enforcement will be on-site directing traffic through the area.

As part of this work, the following detours will be implemented:

- **WB NW 103 Street Detour (NW Corner)**: On October 18, motorists will be detoured via LeJeune Road (southbound), E 48 Street (westbound), and E 7 Avenue (northbound) in resume travel along NW 103 Street.
- **SB LeJeune Road to WB NW 103 Street Detour (NW Corner)**: On October 18, motorists will be detoured via E 48 Street (westbound), and E 7 Avenue (northbound) in order to access westbound NW 103 Street.
- **EB NW 103 Street Detour (SE Corner)**: On October 20, motorists will be detoured via LeJeune Road (southbound), E 47 Street (eastbound), and E 8 Court (northbound) in order to resume travel along NW 103 Street.
- **NB & SB LeJeune Road to EB NW 103 Street Detour (SE Corner)**: On October 20, motorist will be detoured via E 47 Street (eastbound), and E 8 Court (northbound) in order to access eastbound NW 103 Street.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing FDOT roadway project along SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street from W 3 Avenue to E 10 Avenue.
