State Road (SR) 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street Roadway Project Begins September 12 *Between W 3 Avenue and E 10 Avenue*

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of September 12, 2022, along SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street from W 3 Avenue to E 10 Avenue. The work will last roughly ten months and will cost an estimated \$3.4 million.

The scope of work includes: installing new traffic signal mast arms at the intersection of SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street and SR 953/LeJeune Road; extending the left turn lane from EB SR 932/NW 103 Street/W 49 Street to NB SR 953/LeJeune Road; reconstructing the traffic median at the intersection of E 8 Court and E 8 Lane; reconstructing concrete sidewalks, curb ramps, and curb and gutters; upgrading vehicular and pedestrian signs, signals and pavement markings; removing/replace existing light poles and/or installing new light poles with Light Emitting Diode (LED) lights; replacing existing drainage tops; and repaving and restriping the roadway.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes and sidewalks, and to establish detours at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please follow all posted signage and use caution when traveling through the construction zone and note that this scheduled may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
