Roadway Construction Project Begins Week of Monday, October 19

State Road (SR) 93/I-75 Frontage Road/NW 138 Street/W 84 Street

MIAMI, Fla. –The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will begin a roadway construction project on the week of Monday, October 19, 2020. The project limits extend along SR 93/I-75 Frontage Road/NW 138 Street/W 84 Street from east of Hialeah Gardens Boulevard to W 23 Avenue in Miami-Dade County. This project will cost an estimated \$2.8 million and will take seven months to complete.

The scope of work includes: improving roadway capacity at W 24 Avenue by widening at the intersection to accommodate a left-turn lane; installing a new guardrail system along Peter's Pike Canal; providing bike lanes by widening the unpaved shoulder; improving lighting along the corridor; upgrading pedestrian features along the corridor; installing stormwater drainage in the grassy swale areas at multiple locations; upgrading signage and pavement markings; and repaving and restriping the roadway. To complete this work safely, temporary lane closures can occur during non-peak hours on non-event days, nights and weekends.

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
