State Road (SR) 94/Kendall Drive/SW 88 Street Roadway Construction Project Begins February 1, 2021 From SW 150 Avenue to SW 132 Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway construction project the week of February 1, 2021. The limits extend along SR 94/Kendall Drive/SW 88 Street from SW 150 Avenue to SW 132 Avenue and will cost an estimated \$4.6 million.

The work will last roughly one year and it includes the following: Repaving and restriping of the roadway; installing a raised directional median opening for westbound left turns into the middle driveway of Kendall 147 Plaza and a westbound U-turn lane; reconstructing the median traffic separator at 147 Avenue and some intersection medians to provide for offset left turns; reconstructing damaged and uneven sidewalks; adjusting storm drain manholes, upgrading traffic signals and all pavement markings; enhancing pedestrian detectors, ramps, signals and signage; installing countdown pedestrian signal at signalized intersections; providing high emphasis crosswalks at SW 147 Avenue, 142 Avenue, SW 13800 Block, SW 137 Avenue, SW 133 Avenue and SW 132/130 Avenue; and installing new storm water drainage system.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes at times. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts in order to avoid special community events and peak traffic hours. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.
