### **State Road (SR) 953/LeJeune Road Lane Closures at East 32 Street Begin August 30**

**MIAMI, Fla.** – Beginning Monday, August 30 through Friday, September 3, workers will install new traffic signal mast arms through the intersection of SR 953/LeJeune Road and East 32 Street. One mast arm will be installed per day between the hours of 9 a.m. and 2 p.m.

It will be necessary to stop all traffic in one direction at a time for up to 10 minutes to complete installation safely. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

**Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.**
