State Road (SR) 959/NW 57 Avenue Lane Closure Begins April 27

At the Intersection of NW 6 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Wednesday, April 27 at 9 p.m. through Monday, May 2, 2022, at 5:30 a.m., one outside travel lane of northbound SR 959/NW 57 Avenue at the intersection of NW 6 Street will be closed to construct a new traffic island.

During this work, at least one lane along northbound SR 959/NW 57 Avenue will remain open at all times. In order to access NW 6 Street from SR 959/NW 57 Avenue, motorists will be detoured to the following roadways: NW 7 Street (eastbound) and NW 56 Avenue (southbound). Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing roadway construction project along SR 959/NW 57 Avenue between NW 5 Street and NW 7 Street.
