The State Road (SR) 968/SW 1 Street Bridge Now Open to Traffic

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has opened the new SR 968/SW 1 Street Bridge over the Miami River in downtown Miami to vehicular and pedestrian traffic. It will be necessary to close the bridge and detour traffic at times to complete testing the new bridge equipment.

The W Flagler Street Bridge will maintain two-way traffic for the next several weeks. North River Drive and South River Drive will remain closed approaching SW 1 Street and the existing detours will stay in place while crews restore the roadway. Pedestrians will be directed to use the sidewalk on the north side of the First Street Bridge to cross the Miami River.

The bridge will open for marine traffic on demand for vessels under tow.

FDOT began the SR 968/SW 1 Street Bridge Replacement Project in May 2019. The project includes replacing the existing bridge with a new bascule bridge and tender house; reconstructing SW First Street; widening the channel in the Miami River; providing sidewalk connections to the bridge deck and Miami Greenway under the new bridge; and improving stormwater drainage and lighting.

The new bridge eases congestion for vehicular traffic and improves navigation along the Miami River by replacing functional and safety features and increasing Miami River horizontal and vertical clearances. The project is on schedule to be completed in late 2021 at an estimated cost of \$71.5 million.
