State Road (SR) 985/SW 107 Avenue at SW 24 Street/Coral Way Extended Lane Closures to Occur August 16

MIAMI, Fla. – On Wednesday, August 16, the following lanes **will be closed past the standard lane closure reopening hour of 3:30 p.m.** at the intersection of SR 985/SW 107 Avenue and SW 24 Street/Coral Way to install traffic signal foundations:

- <u>SR 985/SW 107 Avenue:</u> One southbound right turn lane to westbound SW 24 Street/Coral Way.
- **SW 24 Street/Coral Way:** One outside westbound through lane.

At least one lane in each direction through the intersection will remain open at all times. Access in and out of local businesses will be maintained. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing intersection project located at SR 985/SW 107 Avenue and SW 24 Street/Coral Way.
