State Road (SR) 985/SW 107 Avenue at SW 24 Street/Coral Way Turning Lanes Closed on June 30 and July 3

MIAMI, Fla. – On Friday, June 30 and Monday, July 3, the following travel lanes will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. to install underground utilities at the intersection of SR 985/SW 107 Avenue and SW 24 Street/Coral Way:

- One outside southbound right turn lane of SR 985/SW 107 Avenue to westbound SW 24 Street/Coral Way
- One outside westbound right turn lane of SW 24 Street/Coral Way to northbound SR 985/SW 107 Avenue

During these closures, drivers can use the inside through lanes of southbound SR 985/SW 107 Avenue and westbound SW 24 Street/Coral Way to turn right. At least one lane in each direction through the intersection will remain open at all times.

Corresponding lane closures for the reconstruction of the traffic median will continue to be implemented during daytime hours. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing intersection project along SR 985/SW 107 Avenue at SW 24 Street/Coral Way.
