### **SR 9A/I-95 Ramp Weeknight Lane Closures Begin Tuesday, September 3**

**MIAMI, Fla.** – As part of necessary ongoing rehabilitation work, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will close ramps along State Road (SR) 9A/Interstate 95 (I-95) to perform stormwater drainage structure installations beginning Tuesday, September 3 through Saturday, September 7.

#### **Tuesday, September 3 through Wednesday, September 4**

Contractors will close the entrance ramp on SW 25 Road onto northbound SR 9A/I-95 for two nights between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to install new stormwater drainage structures. The following detour will be in place

- Continue east on SW 25 Road
- Turn north onto South Miami Avenue
- Turn west on SW 7 Street
- Turn south onto SW 3 Avenue to reach the SW 8 Street on-ramp for northbound I-95

#### **Wednesday, September 4 through Friday, September 6**

Contractors will close at least one lane on the exit ramp from southbound SR 9A/I-95 to SW 25 Road (Exit 1A) for two nights between the hours of 9 p.m. and 6 a.m. to install new stormwater drainage structures and a traffic signal light.

At least one lane on the ramp will remain open at all times and all lanes on the exit ramp will reopen by 6 a.m.

#### **Friday, September 6 through Saturday, September 7**

Contractors will close at least one lane on the exit ramp from SR 9A/I-95 to South Miami Avenue (Exit 2C) between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. to install new stormwater drainage structures.

At least one lane on the ramp will remain open at all times and all lanes on the exit ramp will reopen by 7 a.m.

Please note this schedule may change. Work zones will be clearly marked and access to and from adjacent homes and businesses will be maintained.
