State Road (SR) 9/NW 27 Avenue Nighttime Lane Closures Begin August 17

From NW 116 Street to NW 122 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – On Wednesday, August 17 through Thursday, August 18, 2022, and resuming Sunday, August 21 through Tuesday, August 23, 2022, nighttime lane closures along northbound and/or southbound SR 9/NW 27 Avenue will occur from NW 116 Street to NW 122 Street, between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., for roadway paving.

Please note that nighttime lane closures will not occur Friday, August 19 and Saturday, August 20. During this nighttime operation, one lane will remain open in each direction at all times. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing FDOT roadway project along SR 9/NW 27 Avenue from NW 116 Street to NW 122 Street.
