State Road (SR) 9/NW 27 Avenue Roadway Project Begins Week of July 18

From NW 39 Street to SR 934/NW 79 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is scheduled to begin a roadway construction project the week of July 18, 2022. The project limits extend along SR 9/NW 27 Avenue from NW 39 Street to SR 934/NW 79 Street in the City of Miami and Unincorporated Miami-Dade County. The project will cost an estimated \$5.8 million and is expected to be completed by fall 2023.

The scope of work includes repaving and restriping the roadway; removing abandoned driveways; upgrading drainage inlets; widening the roadway along NW 41 Street; upgrading pedestrian curb ramps and signage; reconstructing and upgrading sidewalks; upgrading guardrail and street signs; and installing new pavement markings.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., weekdays and weekends; 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m., Sunday through Thursday nights; and 11 p.m. to 7 a.m., Friday and Saturday nights. Full weekend closures from 7 p.m. on Friday through 5:30 a.m. on Monday will also be implemented as needed when performing underground work along NW 27 Avenue and along NW 41 Street. Notice will be provided in advance of these closures and detours. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction-related impacts. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.
