State Road (SR) A1A/Harding Avenue/Abbott Avenue Design Project Public Meeting *October 12, 2021*

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six will host a meeting, both in-person and virtually, for a roadway project along SR A1A/Harding Avenue/Abbott Avenue from north of 96 Street to Indian Creek Drive from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, October 12, 2021.

The proposed work includes repaving and restriping the roadway; adjusting the existing manholes and utility valves; upgrading pedestrian curb ramps, reconstructing damaged sidewalks and curb and gutter; upgrading signage; upgrading guardrail and pavement markings; installing high emphasis crosswalk markings at all signalized intersections; adding new pedestrian countdown detectors where missing; replacing damaged traffic signals at 69 Street, 71 Street, 96 Street and 9600 Block; trimming trees and shrubs obstructing sight; relocating crosswalks; upgrading drainage and removing abandoned driveways and modifying existing driveways at various locations.

Construction is expected to begin March 2023 and last about one year. The estimated construction cost for this project is \$4.8 million.

The meeting will consist of a formal presentation followed by an open discussion. Staff will be available to answer questions in the order they are received and as time permits. If your question is not responded to during the meeting, a response will be provided in writing afterwards.
