## SR A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard Nighttime Construction and New Traffic Pattern

**MIAMI, Fla.** – As part of the ongoing roadway project along State Road (SR) A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard from Bertha Street to the east end of Smathers Beach, contractors for the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will begin repaving and restriping the road on Monday, June 17. Work will be performed between 9:30 p.m. and 5 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and is expected to be completed by Friday, June 21.

To perform this work safely, travel lanes will be closed, and flaggers will direct traffic through the work zone. One lane will remain open, and traffic will be stopped to allow traffic from the opposite direction to pass. The speed limit will be reduced through the work zone. Drivers should expect delays and seek alternate routes if possible.

Once completed, travel lanes will shift to the south and construction will begin on the north side of the road. Drivers traveling west/inbound should follow signs to merge left onto the new single inbound lane.

Access to and from adjacent residences and businesses will be maintained and the Promenade will remain open for pedestrians and cyclists travelling through the area.

Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unexpected conditions.
