Second Lane on State Road (SR) 836 Ramp to Northbound I-95 Opening on August 4

MIAMI Fla. - On Thursday morning, August 4, 2022, a second lane on the eastbound SR 836 ramp to northbound I-95 will be opened as part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project. The additional lane, a major milestone for the project, will bring much needed relief to drivers in the area that are currently experiencing heavy congestion. The second lane will add capacity and increase mobility for drivers heading north on I-95.

In addition to opening the second lane on the ramp to northbound I-95, a second lane will be restored on the ramp to southbound I-95. Drivers should continue to use caution when driving through the area as there is active construction taking place adjacent to the travel lanes.

The work is part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project that will reconstruct the I-395 corridor from the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge, including the construction of a Signature Bridge over NE 2 Avenue and Biscayne Boulevard; double-deck SR 836 from west of NW 17 Avenue to the Midtown Interchange and the replacement of the concrete pavement on I-95 from NW 8 Street to NW 29 Street.
