### **Snake Creek Bridge Closed to Marine Traffic in Advance of Hurricane Elsa** *In Monroe County*

**MIAMI, Fla.** – In preparation for Hurricane Elsa, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), in coordination with the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) and Monroe County, has closed the Snake Creek Bridge to marine traffic in advance of tropical storm-force winds (39 mph or higher). The bridge will remain closed to marine navigation for the duration of severe weather and until the drawbridge and waterway can be assessed for damages.

Mariners who need to navigate through the Snake Creek drawbridge are advised that the bridge may not be operating on normal publicized schedules as early as 36 hours prior to the forecasted storm arrival. The drawbridge will not be operating upon arrival of gale-force winds (34 knots or higher) or following a mandatory Monroe County evacuation order.

The Snake Creel Bridge is currently expected to reopen for marine traffic at 9 a.m., Tuesday, July 6, but that schedule could change.
