State Road (SR) 933/NW 12 Avenue Rail Crossing Closure

Wednesday, October 13 – Thursday, October 21, 2021

MIAMI, Fla. – The South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will close NW 12 Avenue from NW 20 Street to NW 23 Street in Miami-Dade County from 8 p.m. Wednesday, October 13 through 4 a.m. Thursday, October 21, 2021, weather permitting. This detour is being established to allow workers to reconstruct the railroad crossing.

During this closure, all traffic will be detoured away from the crossing and directed to follow signs to alternate local streets. Business access through NW 13 Avenue shall remain open, as well as Metrorail station access through NW 12 Avenue and NW 11 Avenue.

Traffic along NW 12 Avenue will be detoured as follows:

Northbound Main Detour:

- Turn right on NW 20 Street
- Turn left on NW 10 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 24 Street to get back to NW 12 Avenue

Southbound Main Detour:

- Turn right on NW 23 Street.
- Turn left on NW 14 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 20 Street to get back to NW 12 Avenue
