State Road (SR) 953/LeJeune Road Mast Arm Installation Begins April 15

From East 41 Street to East 42 Street

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning the week of April 15, short-term full closures will be implemented as needed for the installation of the new traffic signal mast arms at the intersections of East 41 Street and east 42 Street from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Law enforcement will be on-site to provide assistance as needed. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing roadway project along SR 953/LeJeune Road from NW 79 Street/E 25 Street to NW 103 Street/E 49 Street.
