State Road (SR) A1A/South Roosevelt Boulevard Roadway Project to Begin Construction the week of Sunday, April 28, 2024

from Riviera Canal Bridge at Go Lane to SR 5/US 1/North Roosevelt Boulevard

MIAMI, Fla. – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six is scheduled to begin a roadway project the week of Sunday, April 28, 2024, on S. Roosevelt Boulevard from Riviera Canal Bridge at Go Lane to SR 5/US 1/N. Roosevelt Boulevard. The project is one of five separate construction projects slated for Monroe County, which includes the project currently underway on S. Roosevelt Boulevard along Smathers Beach. This section of the S. Roosevelt Boulevard project will last seven months and cost \$790,000. Schedules may change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

The scope of work on this project includes upgrading signage, pavement markings and curb ramps, as well as repaving and restriping the roadway.

To build this project safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes and sidewalks, and establish detours at times. Lane closures may occur during the day Monday through Thursday, and at night Sunday through Thursday. Work will be done in stages to minimize construction related impacts. Drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible. Please use caution when traveling through construction zones.

Please follow all posted signage and note that this schedule may change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.
