State Road (SR) 994/Quail Roost Drive Lane Closures Begin May 2

From west of SW 127 Avenue to Homestead Avenue

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Monday, May 2 through Thursday, June 30, 2022, travel lanes along SR 994/Quail Roost Drive from west of SW 127 Avenue to Homestead Avenue will be closed in both directions between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., for roadway paving. During this operation, at least one travel lane in each direction will remain open at all times.

The work is expected to last about two months. Drivers should anticipate delays traveling through this area and seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through construction zones and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing roadway and lighting project along SR 994/Quail Roost Drive from west of SW 127 Avenue to SR 5/US 1/S Dixie Highway.
