Traffic Shift Along State Road (SR) 972/Coral Way Begins February 6 *At The Intersection of SW 15 Road*

MIAMI, Fla. – Beginning Monday, February 6 through Wednesday, February 8, between 9 p.m. and 5:30 a.m., crews will begin the second phase of roundabout construction by performing a traffic shift along the eastbound SR 972/Coral Way travel lanes and converting them into a single lane in each direction (one eastbound and one westbound).

Once the traffic shift is implemented, the following lanes will be continuously closed until the second phase of construction is complete:

- Eastbound SR 972/Coral Way to SW 3 Avenue
 - *Detoured via SW 2 Avenue (northbound) and SW 12 Street (westbound)*
- Eastbound SR 972/Coral Way to SW 15 Road (North Leg)
 - *Detoured via SW 2 Avenue (northbound), SW 12 Street (westbound), and SW 3 Avenue (southbound)*
- Eastbound and Westbound SR 972/Coral Way to SW 15 Road (South Leg)
 - *Detoured via SW 2 Avenue (southbound)*

Pedestrian detours will also be implemented during this phase of construction. Please follow all posted signage and note that drivers might experience delays traveling through the area and should seek alternate routes if possible.

Please use caution when traveling through the construction zone and note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.

This work is part of the ongoing roundabout project at the intersection of SR 972/Coral Way at SW 15 Road.
