Full Closure of Westbound I-395 at I-95 Tonight

MIAMI, Fla. – On Thursday, February 25, all westbound lanes on I-395 will be closed at I-95 between the hours 11 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. to allow the contractor to place temporary concrete barrier wall on the roadway. The I-395 ramps to northbound and southbound I-95, and the ramps from I-95 to westbound SR 836 will remain open during this time frame.

Drivers continuing west to SR 836 can:

- Access the southbound I-95 ramp
- Exit at SW 7 Street/Brickell Avenue (Exit 1B), then turn left at SW 8 Street
- Enter the northbound I-95 ramp, then enter the westbound SR 836 ramp

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.

The work is part of the I-395/SR 836/I-95 Design-Build Project that will reconstruct the I-395 corridor from the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge, including the construction of a Signature Bridge over NE 2 Avenue and Biscayne Boulevard; double-deck SR 836 from west of NW 17 Avenue to the Midtown Interchange and the replacement of the concrete pavement on I-95 from NW 8 Street to NW 29 Street.
